- The city of Sakarya, one of the most important cities in Turkey for its rapid growth and development.



I first learned about the production process of the composite panel, then did different mechanical tests to determine different mechanical properties of composite and its constituent. I also did numerical simulation on the forming of composite panel using multi-point forming process.

- Traveling in Turkey is cheap, Do not miss visiting many historical and touristic places like Cappadocia, Pamukkale and Antalya.








Das Leben danach...
